Brazil elections

On October 28, 2018 Brazil elected a new president for the 2019-2022 term. Jair Bolsonaro, 63, had 55,1% of the valid votes. A far-right candidate, Bolsonaro, a former army captain, has served as a member of the Chamber of Deputies, representing the state of Rio de Janeiro, since 1991. He is a member of the Social Liberal Party (PSL).

Global Landscape Forum

Global Landscape Forum (GLF) is led by the Center of International Forestry Research (CIFOR) in coordination with other founding partners - UN Environment and the World Bank. The main funding is provided by the German Government. GLF is the first global movement of its kind and the largest knowledge-led multi-sectoral platform on landscapes. It has connected over 150,000 participants representing more than over 3,900 organizations during the previous editions in Warsaw, Lima, London, Paris, Marrakech, Jakarta, Bonn, Washington, D.C. and Nairobi, along the years.

"How to make progress on sustainability commitments" is the main goal of the forum in Katowice, this year, highlighting the 5 core GLF themes: The Paris Agreement, the Sustainable Development Goals, the New York Declaration on Forests, the Bonn Challenge and the Aichi Biodiversity Targets.

This year, the World Bank will hold a couple events at the Forum: remarks from Karin Kemper (Senior Director, environment & Natural Resources) and a discussion forum on Landscape Programs in Action: Experiences from the Field. Besides, WB will have a have a booth where staff will share WB projects achievements on forests and landscapes, with key stakeholders.

Great news! The Brazil FIP Integrated Landscape Management in the Cerrado Biome (FIP Landscape) was approved by the Board of Directors of the World Bank on October 29. The Grant Agreement between the Bank and GIZ was signed last November 7, 2018, at the World Bank office, in Brasilia. This project inaugurates an unprecedented partnership between the World Bank and GIZ in Brazil, and also between Agriculture and the Environment sectors in Brazil, promoting the sustainable management of the landscape in the Cerrado Biome. The Project is a donation from the Forest Investment Fund, FIP, in the amount of US \$ 21m. All the partners involved, GIZ, SFB, MAPA and SENAR are very excited to start implementation.

The next steps are: 1) compliance with the effectiveness clauses (confirmation that the Grant Agreement signature has been legally authorized, and cooperation and subsidiary agreements duly established; and Project Operational Manual has been adopted in the form and content acceptable to the World Bank. and, at last statement of project effectiveness.

The Bakairi Indigenous Women's Meeting, held from August 27 to 31, 2018 had the objective of discussing issues related to Environmental and Territorial Management and Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation, Forest Carbon Stocks Conservation, Sustainable Forest Management and Increase in Forest Carbon Stocks (REED +).
